## Capital Projects Update March 2024



#### > Main Building Air Handler Unit Installations – In Progress

- Due to challenges at turn-on for both AHU 1 (2<sup>nd</sup> floor) and AHU 24 (basement) neither unit will be fully operational until May as we await part delivery for each unit
- Construction permit has been extended through June 14, 2024
- Clifton Campus Exterior Improvements & Wayfinding In Progress
- Foundations for all exterior signage have been poured and entrance signs to be completed by April 5th
- Landscaping and Main building Automotive Wing garages/roadway work will start in late Spring

#### Clifton Campus Master Plan – In Progress

 Anticipate final draft for Facilities Committee review in April, before Board approval in May

#### **ATLC Roof Replacement**

- ~\$3.2 Million project for 45,215 s/f of area replaced over four months
- Starts on April 13<sup>th,</sup> with substantial completion planned by August 17<sup>,</sup> 2024
- Practical Nursing Skills Lab Renovation
- ~\$600k project, including renovations and equipment funded by Hamilton County ARPA Grant
- Construction in Main 266, 268, and 270 to begin in May 6<sup>th</sup> with substantial completion by July 31, 2024



#### **Key Points Related Self-Funding Insurance**

#### Self-funding advantageous to Cstate?

Conservative estimate of savings at least \$5M over the years

#### **Providers other than Anthem and United considered?**

No as other networks, Aetna, Cigna, MMO, etc. don't have as strong network discounts. As such, we would experience higher costs through lower discounts.

#### \$7.4M in budget?

Yes, this will be budgeted in the benefits category in FY25 (as prior years) with a participation hedge to account for open enrollment period





# 24.22 Vendor Contracts Approval



#### **24.22 Contracts Resolution**

WHEREAS, the College has complied with Ohio Revised Code, the Ohio Administrative Code, and/or Ohio Revised Code 123.10 in its procurement processes, and in doing so, recommends contracts as follows:

- AEP: \$216,424 Electricity supply. Partial hedge of 25% against future electricity costs to begin in January 2025. Funded via General Fund.
- 2. Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield. \$7,414,218. Health insurance administrative services including claims and reinsurance for health insurance plan beginning July 1, 2024. Funded via General Fund.
- Pocket Nurse: \$175,813. Fixtures and furnishings for LPN Skill Lab Remodel. Funded via Hamilton County ARPA Grant.
- SMP Architect: \$65,000. Design of Main 176 & 180 air handler units. Funded via General Fund or Stimulus Lost Revenue.
- William R. Zalla dba Wilfran Industries: \$125,874. Two-year lease renewal at \$5,244.75 per month (7/1/23 6/30/25) at 5746 Este avenue in support of the Fire Service Technology program. Funded via General Fund.
- Vincent Light Systems: \$132,797. Audio Visual Production Lab lighting and controls replacement. Funded via General Fund.
- American Façade Restoration: \$60,320. WDC Evendale exterior brick power washing and masonry tuckpointing repairs. Funded via General Fund.
- Spectra Contract Flooring: \$56,320. Clifton Campus Main Building concrete floor refinishing rooms 101 A & B and 141. Funded via General Fund.


