



If you are in college and you need help affording enough nutritious food, you may be able to get SNAP (food stamps), even if you *didn't* qualify before.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides funds on a pre-loaded card, like a debit card, to help you purchase groceries.

To be eligible, your monthly gross household income must be at or below:

	1 person \$1,383
	2 people \$1,868
	3 people \$2,353
	4 people \$2,839
	5 people \$3,324
Each additional person +\$486	

As a college student, you must also meet at least ONE of the following criteria:

Attend school less than half-time	Work an average of 80 hours/month
Qualify for a work study program	Care for a child under 6 (or under 11 if a sole caregiver)
Be under age 18 OR over age 49	Have a documented physical or mental disability
NEW DUE TO COVID-19 EMERGENCY: Any student with a \$0 Expected Family Contribution (EFC) on FAFSA
